## **Sperm Donation Program**

## **Sperm Donor**

- Sperm donated by men between the age of 21 and below 41 at the point of sperm removal
- · Performed in Singapore
- Nurse will assess the donor's intent, ensure the potential donor meets the age criteria
- Explain the process of the sperm donor and fill up a lifestyle questionnaire (Live Donor Assessment Questionnaire).
- Fill up potential donor particulars in KKH National Sperm bank clearance form.
- It is important to ensure that clearance from KKH National sperm bank is received before proceeding to other assessments.
- Outcome of donor must be reported to KKH National Sperm Bank.
- Sperm samples should not be used after 5 live-birth events.
- Psychosocial assessment must be done together with the spouse if the potential donor is married.
- The Psychiatrist/ Psychologist shall assess the potential donor on suitability to donate.
- Psychological reply shall endorsed by The Clinical Governance Officer

## What does this involve?

 Nurse shall arrange an appointment with Doctor for donor consent taking, blood screening and the doctor shall fill up the donor's clinical assessment direct into the IVF database system.



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- Bloods for Full Blood Count, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, VDRL, HIV, CMV blood IgG, IgM, HTLV Type I and II, urine Gonorrhoea, Chlamydia and urine CMV isolation, blood group and Rh will be taken
- When the results are out, the CARE nurse shall arrange sperm sample collection.
- Each sperm samples is checked for mycoplasma, Gonorrhoea culture, Aerobic bacteria culture, Urine for C.Trachomatis and N Gonorrhoeae PCR and CMV at each sperm collection.
- Infectious screening blood test shall be repeated 3 months after the last sperm sample taken.

## Extra pointers:

- Donors shall be given at least 7 days to consider
- Consent shall be done after the 7 days of consideration
- Spouse consent is required if donor is married.
- Donor can withdraw consent if donated samples are not used.
