4. Overview4.1 Background information	Geriatric Medicine in SGH aims to provide holistic care for the older individual across inpatient, outpatient and community settings.		
	Clinical fellows will be able to observe and participate in the care and management of older individuals admitted to the department as well as patients referred from other disciplines for specialist consults. They will learn how to provide an orthogeriatric consult and co-management service for patients with hip fractures admitted to Orthopedics so as to improve outcomes at individual as well as hospital level. They will be able to see patients referred to outpatient clinics for evaluation and management of geriatric syndromes.		
	In addition, they will be able to participate in Multidisciplinary rounds with Community teams (Geriatric Services Hub), Community partners (Active Global), other disciplines (geriatric oncology) as well as upcoming collaborations with Psychiatry in providing multidisciplinary input to nursing homes and day care centres.		
	Fellows interested in setting up educational programmes for medical students in their own countries will be able to observe teachings conducted by the department for students doing their geriatric medicine rotation.		
4.2 Goal/ aim(s)	 Provide training in the holistic care and management of the older individual encompassing complex medical, functional and psychosocial aspects Provide training in the assessment and management of geriatric syndromes Impart knowledge and skills in the co-management of the geriatric patient with other disciplines (orthogeriatrics, referrals from other disciplines) Provide training in working with allied health professionals and community partners with the aim of enhancing care of the older individual.

	<u>Note</u> : The doctor should be in active clinical practice (and been registered as a medical practitioner in the countries of practice) for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration in Singapore.	
	 In addition to the above criteria, Clinical Fellows must: a) Have a minimum of 3 years working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent) b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is <u>not</u> in English c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or medical degree in his country or overseas d) Be sponsored by (i) the government, or (ii) regional health authority or (iii) an appropriate institution in the home country. For (d)(iii), the doctor must be on current full-time employment (40 hours or more per week) with the sponsoring institution. 	
	As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under <u>direct</u> supervision or Level 1 supervision under SMC's Supervisory Framework.	
6. Learning Objectives	This fellowship would allow the Fellow to acquire:	
	 Knowledge and skills in holistic care of the older individual Skills in assessment and management of acute medical conditions in the admitted older individual with complex multimorbidity, functional and psychosocial issues Skills in the assessment of the older individual with geriatric syndromes and conditions in an inpatient and outpatient setting (impaired cognition, falls and impaired mobility, osteoporosis, incontinence and iatrogenesis) Knowledge and skills in the assessment of frailty Skills in providing specialist geriatric input for orthogeriatric patients Skills in discharge planning and referral to relevant community support Skills in conducting a multidisciplinary round; taking into consideration input of members of a multidisciplinary team and subsequently formulating a care plan.
