5. Target Audience	The Fellowship is targeted at surgeons who have completed their residency training and have a special interest in head and neck surgery.		
5.1 Pre-requisite /eligibility requirement(s)	<ul> <li>General requirements for Temporary Registration for training (required by SMC): <ul> <li>A basic medical degree from an accredited medical university or medical school</li> <li>Passed the relevant national licensing examination in the country of conferment of conferment of basic degree, where applicable</li> <li>Evidence of at least 12 months houseman-ship / internship with a certificate of satisfactory completion of houseman-ship or equivalent</li> <li>Been registered as a medical practitioner in the country where he is currently practising</li> <li>Been certified to be of good standing by the Medical Council or the relevant national authority</li> </ul> </li> <li>Note: The doctor should be in active clinical practice (and been registered as a medical practice) for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration in Singapore.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>a) Have a minimum of 3 years working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent)</li> <li>b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is <u>not</u> in English</li> <li>c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or medical degree in his country or overseas</li> <li>d) Be sponsored by (i) the government, or (ii) regional health authority or (iii) an appropriate institution in the home country. 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	current full-time employment (40 hours or more per week) with the sponsoring institution. As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under <u>direct</u> supervision or Level 1 supervision under SMC's Supervisory Framework.
	<ol> <li>Department's requirement, if any (only for Fellows in this subspecialty):</li> <li>A minimum of five years of surgical training and completion of exit examinations or its equivalent in the specialty of General Surgery or Otolaryngology. Oral Maxillofacial Surgeons who are doubly-qualified with valid dental and medical qualifications may also apply.</li> <li>Engagement in Head and Neck Surgery training or practice.</li> <li>Submission of at least 1 publication or presentation at an Overseas Conference.</li> </ol>
6. Learning Objectives	This fellowship would allow the Fellow to acquire experience in the management of head and neck malignancies as part of a multidisciplinary team.
	<ul> <li>Fellows will be expected to achieve the following by the end of the fellowship:</li> <li>Take an appropriate history from a patient.</li> <li>Perform a complete head and neck examination (including fiberoptic examination)</li> <li>Order appropriate investigations to workup and stage a patient with a newly diagnosed or suspected head and neck malignancy and perform biopsies.</li> <li>Interpret head and neck imaging studies and its application in surgical planning.</li> <li>Be able to perform resection of head and neck malignancies in a safe and competent manner.</li> <li>Be aware of the available reconstructive options available for reconstruction after resection of head and neck malignancies.</li> <li>Be able to describe indications for adjuvant therapy (i.e. chemotherapy or radiation therapy).</li> <li>Be competent in the inpatient perioperative care of patients undergoing treatment for head and neck malignancies.</li> <li>Be able to work in a multidisciplinary setting together with allied health professionals (e.g. physiotherapists, speech therapists, occupational therapists, dieticians, clinical psychologists) in the holistic care of patients with advanced head and neck malignancies.</li> </ul>

Course/Training Syllabus	<ul> <li>The fellow will be exposed to the management of the following conditions:</li> <li>Oral cavity and lip neoplasms</li> <li>Nasal cavity and paranasal sinus neoplasms</li> <li>Pharyngeal and Esophageal neoplasms</li> <li>Laryngeal and Tracheal neoplasms</li> <li>Salivary gland neoplasms</li> <li>Thyroid and parathyroid neoplasms</li> <li>Skin, Soft tissue and bone neoplasms of the head and neck</li> </ul>

9. Assessment and Evaluation	Fellows will need to demonstrate their proficiency level based on the following competencies:         1) Patient Care         Fellows will be expected to be able to manage patients with head and neck malignancy throughout their clinical journey, from diagnosis, staging, treatment as well as follow-up and surveillance.         2) Medical Knowledge         Fellows will be expected to display professional knowledge at a level that allows them to manage patients with head and neck malignancies safely and independently when they exit the fellowship programme.         3) Practice-Based Learning and Improvement         Surgical techniques.         4) Interpersonal and Communication Skills         Fellows will be expected to participate in communication with patients and their families as part of the surgical team (e.g. update of patient condition, breaking bad news etc.)         5) Professionalism         Fellows should not take any leave of absence unless approved by their supervisors. They should display a commitment to training and learning.         6) Systems-Based Practice         Fellows should help to co-ordinate care in a multidisciplinary setting together with the relevant subspecialties (e.g. radiation oncology, medical oncology) as well as
