4. Overview4.1 Background information	This programme is tailored for Urologists who have an interest in renal transplantation and laparoscopy, especially those who aim to grow the field or service in their own institutions.		
	They will be exposed to the pre-, peri- and post-operative care of renal transplant patients as well as the workflow and set up of an established transplant programme. They will also have the opportunity to observe/assist in a variety of urological procedures performed laparoscopically at our institution.		
4.2 Goal/ aim(s)	The aim of the programme is to equip the Fellow with standard techniques of renal transplantation and safe practices in laparoscopic donor nephrectomy. Besides surgical technique, the Fellow should gain understanding of pre-operative assessment for both donors and recipients, perioperative care, long term care and management of surgical complications.		
4.3 Duration	 6-12 months depending on: Candidate's existing experience and clinical skills in transplantation/laparoscopy A 12-month program will provide more opportunity for exposure to transplant care as the case volume is variable.

5. Target Audience	Practicing Urologists with an interest in gaining experience in renal transplantation and establishing or expanding the transplant service in their institution. Should have some prior basic experience with renal transplantation and is currently working in an institution performing renal transplants or which has plans to develop the service.

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	 Been certified to be of good standing by the Medical Council or the relevant national authority <u>Note</u>: The doctor should be in active clinical practice (and been registered as a medical practitioner in the countries of practice) for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration in Singapore. In addition to the above criteria, Clinical Fellows must: a) Have a minimum of 3 years working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent) b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is <u>not</u> in English c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or medical degree in his country or overseas d) Be sponsored by (i) the government, or (ii) regional health authority or (iii) an appropriate institution in the home country. For (d)(iii), the doctor must be on 	
	 current full-time employment (40 hours or more per week) with the sponsoring institution. As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under <u>direct</u> supervision or Level 1 supervision under SMC's Supervisory Framework. Department's requirement, if any (only for Fellows in this subspecialty): Postgraduate qualification in Urology (FRCS Urology or equivalent) Minimum 2 years of postgraduate training experience in relevant specialty Has at least basic laparoscopic skills Preferably has some experience and interest in research
